

# Reading Role Models

We have introduced a new reward at school to celebrate children who are being excellent role models for reading! Children will receive a 'Reading Role Model' sticker if they have been reading regularly at home.

Every half term, a name from every class will be randomly selected and that child will get to choose a book which will be purchased for them by school.


#### Ideas of items to donate



This is completely OPTIONAL and children are more than welcome to come to school in their uniform if they prefer.




### **Book swap!**


