Dear Parents,

We have introduced a program to all year groups at school called myHappymind. myHappymind is all based around helping children to understand how their brain works and to support them in developing positive skills and habits to be their very best selves!

myHappymind is delivered in schools by class teachers through a series of interactive lessons and then the children apply these learnings throughout the day. To further embed this learning and ensure that you are able to engage in these topics with your child, myHappymind has developed a set of resources for parents. These resources can be accessed online on your computer, or through an app on your phone. The resources allow children to continue to practise some of the habits they have developed at school and for you to learn more about what they are learning in the program. Also included are activities for you to do together at home, to complement the in-school lessons.

## What is a faith trail?

A faith trail is an exciting opportunity to visit one of Derby's fantastic places of worship through an immersive experience.

Faith Trails are linked to the curriculum but also support in Promoting British Values in schools, visits are designed to help visiting groups to understand the beliefs of others, breaking down barriers and encouraging tolerance and understanding.

The Open Centre's motto is 'Promoting understanding through personal experience' – and there is no better way to do this than to encourage visits to the different places of worship in our community.

### What happens during a visit?

Each Place of Worship is a short walk away from the Open Centre. Each talk/visit usually lasts between 45 minutes and 1 hour, with plenty of opportunities to explore and ask questions on a range of topics. Most of these visits take place in the morning so we do not disrupt prayer schedules at the Places of Worship. I

**All visits** are led by Open Centre staff, many of whom are also from a particular faith community. As part of the visits, children will have the opportunity to take part in a range of interactive activities in order to get to know the faith better or to gain a clearer understanding how the building is used.
